Using Epsom Salts for your dog's feet.

For use as advised by your veterinarian


 Get the dog treats ready!
 Get a small plastic container deep enough to put your dog' foot in - an ice cream container is often ideal.

 If the foot is really dirty then shampoo or rinse it first.

4) Add warm water and epsom salts - roughly 1 cup (450g) of epsom salts to 1 pint (just over 500mls) of warm water.

5) Gently place your
dog's paw in the water,
making sure in is fully
covered
6) Give treats!

7) Wait 5 minutes with your dog's paw in the solution
8) Give treats!









9) Remove you dog's paw from the water and gently examine the underside. If you see any blackheads or trapped hairs, gently squeeze or pull out with tweezers

10) Pat foot dry.
11) Give treats!
12) Do on other affected feet.
13) Repeat every ____days
14) Recheck with your veterinarian in ____days
